Marian Feasts: October: Ave Maria

7: Our Lady of the Rosary. This feast was instituted by St. Pius V in thanksgiving for Mary's assistance during the battle of Lepanto. According to Church tradition St. Dominic was the first to teach and preach the Rosary in 1213.

12: Our Lady of Aparecida: In 1717 three Brazilian fishermen found a statue of Our Lady in the Paraiba river.....and then found themselves overwhelmed by a miraculous catch of fish. Our Lady of Aparecida is the patroness of Brazil, her feast is celebrated on the 12th.

12: Our Lady of the Pillar: She appeared to St. James in Saragosse to encourage him during his mission in Spain. Devotion grew and in 1730 Pope Clement XII declared her patroness of Spain and all Hispanic peoples.



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MARY is present in a very special way during the months of September and October. The feasts succeed one another providing us with a wonderful opportunity to renew our devo tion to Mary, Mother of God and our Mother too. The more intense your desire in prayer the stronger and more effective will your prayer be. It is the loving wish which is important—and not the words we use. Why not decide sometimes to say the rosary in this way:

* ask the Blessed Virgin in union with her Son to obtain for you the grace to be faithful to each of the commandments..

* or ask for forgiveness for any sins committed against the commandments. * or to obtain with each Ave Maria deliverance from the seven capital sins, and from sins of thought, words or deeds.

* or to obtain each of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit and the three theological virtues, faith, hope and charity with a heart felt desire to obtain each gift and virtue as you say the Hail Mary.

MARY companion on our faith journey Although Peter Vigne

never wrote a book

about Our Lady all his writings show how intimately present she was in his missionary life and in his life as Founder of a religious Congregation. She is the living Gospel who brings us the Good News of Jesus her Son. Peter Vigne wanted Mary present at every station of the extended Way of the Cross he built in Boucieu. Mary is also present at every sad and sorrowful "station" of our lives, always close and attentive to us, just as she was at the wedding feast at Cana.

The method proposed by Peter Vigne for praying the Rosary is surprising and guite novel ... Before this, of course, he spoke about the joyful, the sorrowful and glorious mysteries.



But here, he is asking Mary's help for very specific needs. Why ? What has he in mind when he suggests this method of prayer?

What has he to say to us today? Quite simply, that the Virgin Mary is the Mother who is close to all those who follow her Son, to every Christian.

A decade of the Rosary considering the Commandments of God? These "ten precepts" of God, engraved on the Tablets of the Law and also written on our hearts tell us "what is reguired in the love of God and love of neighbour" CCC 2067. Mary is there to help us live them ... giving us the courage to pick ourselves up and start again when we fail to respect them.

Why pray an Ave Maria considering the seven deadly sins and sins of thought, word and deed? Because Mary is with us in whatever difficulties and challenges we face as we try to live consciously and with integrity the Good News of her Son.

An Ave Maria with each of the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit and the virtues of faith, hope and charity. Why ? Because "the theological virtues are the foundation of Christian moral activity; they animate it and give it its special character" our catechism tells us. (1813) Who better than Mary to help us live them and make us more attentive to the action of the Holy Spirit in us as we welcome his Gifts?

Peter Vigne thus gives us leads which might seem surprising but in fact they make us revisit our life with Mary, our model and guide. In this way she invites us to correspond better to the love of God ... "in every detail", as Father Vigne says.

Why not occasionally pray a decade of the Rosary in this way during these two months? B.R.

Marian Feasts: September

8th...Nativity of Mary: The church celebrates only three nativities: Jesus' birth, Mary's birth and John the Baptist's birth. Fr. Vigne and the Sisters chose this day in 1722 for the celebration of their First Vows.

12th...Holy Name of Mary: Established in 1683 and restored by John Paul 11 in 2002. "The name of Mary is the key of the gates of Heaven", (St. Ephrem).

15th ... Seven Sorrows of Mary: This feast recalls the compassion of Mary accompanying her Son to Calvary. Fr. Vigne dedicated a chapel in her honour as part of the Way of the Cross, Boucieu.

MARY our powerful INTERCESSOR

At the wedding of Cana the Gospel clearly shows the power of Mary's intercession as she makes known to Jesus the needs of others: "They have no wine" (Jn 2:3). The Rosary is both meditation and supplication. Insistent prayer to the Mother of God is based on confidence that her maternal intercession can obtain all things from the

heart of her Son. She is "allpowerful by grace", to use the bold expression, which needs to be properly understood, of Blessed Bartolo Longo ... This is a conviction which, beginning with the Gospel, has grown ever more firm in the experience of the Chris-

tian people. The supreme poet Dante expresses it marvellously in the lines sung by Saint Bernard: "Lady, thou art so great and so powerful, that whoever desires grace yet does not turn to thee, would have his desire fly without wings". When in the Rosary we plead with Mary, the sanctuary of the Holy Spirit (cf. Lk 1:35), she intercedes for us before the Father who filled her with grace and before the Son born of her womb, praying with us and for John Paul 11 Rosary of the Virgin Mary. 16 us.

Mary, Virgin and Mother,... Obtain for us now a new ardour born of the resurrection, that we may bring to all the Gospel of life which triumphs over death. Mother of the living Gospel, wellspring of happiness for God's little ones, pray for us. Amen. Alleluia!
