

The focus of his reflection is to encourage children and young people to make the best use of their study time and succeed in doing so. One could also "extend" this encouragement to people of any age, job or occupation. Peter Vigne wants us to live a life of goodness and to spread it far and wide. That doesn't necessarily mean doing great things but doing things with "great" love and knowing how to say often: **MY GOD I THANK YOU, because from you comes all that is GOOD**".

Encouraged to do good


"We could lead the person we are praising to believe that his virtuousness depends solely on his own will and that consequently he is the author of his own goodness...."

Children need to be encouraged to practice virtue and to shun sin, but one must praise them wisely, encouraging them to continue on the path of goodness.

Besides, this is how they discern what is worthy of merit and what God loves most!

Furthermore, those who hear words of praise are much more inclined to put into practice what they hear.

*However, we must make sure to impress upon the children that **God is the principle of all the good we do.** All wisdom comes from him, and without him we cannot entertain a good thought or accomplish a good deed in view of our eternal Happiness".*

PETER VIGNE, BOOKS AND MISSION

On September 19 we remember Peter Vigne's priestly ordination 329 years ago!
 From 1694 to 1740 his life as a priest was fully given to the mission of proclaiming the Good News in the villages and towns where he was sent to awaken and invigorate the faith of the "dear Christians" who were quite abandoned or all too often forgotten!
 However, he wasn't contented just to preach a mission and move on without further contact. For this reason he made time to write books to **sustain the fruits of the missions** among those who could read and then share them with those who felt excluded.

"In the small room that serves as his bedroom, Peter Vigne is probably the only inhabitant of Boucieu "burning the midnight oil". He has been writing now for some time. **This activity is also part of his apostolate** and frequently his books continue his missionary work, reflecting the same spirituality, the same passionate love that sets his own heart on fire. Any free time available to him he uses to compose books of doctrine and **meditations**. These are not presented as scholarly works but as words to **awaken the soul and stimulate the spirit**. His sole focus is on the simplicity of the Gospel.....and anyone interested in getting to know him better will discern a man who is humble and unassuming.
 Since he doesn't speak for the sake of speaking neither does he want to presume empty eloquence. He certainly disapproves of those who act in such a manner: "You are, in the presence of those who delight in listening to you, like tunes of pleasant music, which they hear with pleasure but then fail to practice," he writes, with good reason in his book Heures Nouvelles.



After a few minutes reflection he turns over the page and continues writing. It's already late into the night, but he knows that **his missionary outreach is to maintain the impact of his sermons after his missions.**

October: month of the ROSARY

"Jesus, gentle Saviour, honoured Mary his Mother with his light and filled her with his love." Peter Vigne



Against the background of the words *Ave Maria* the principal events of the life of Jesus Christ..... put us in **communion with Jesus through the heart of his Mother**. At the same time our heart can embrace in the decades of the Rosary all the events that make up the lives of individuals, families, nations, the Church, and all mankind including our personal concerns and those of our neighbour, especially those who are closest to us, who are dearest to us. Thus **the simple prayer of the Rosary marks the rhythm of human life**.
 The Rosary mystically transports us to Mary's side as she is busy watching over the human growth of Christ in the home of Nazareth. This enables her to train us and to mould us with the same care, until Christ is "fully formed" in us.
 ..**Confidently take up the Rosary once again and** rediscover it in the light of Scripture, in harmony with the Liturgy, and in the context of your daily lives.
