DON'T FORGET THE FOLLOWING DATES

SEPTEMBER 8th, joyfully celebrate the Nativity of the Virgin Mary.

On the September 8 1722, in Boucieu, after making a spiritual retreat preached by Father Vigne, the Sisters of Boucieu and Rochepaule, together pronounced their First Vows. From then on, the Congregation continued to spread and more communities were established following many requests from various dioceses.

>>>The 8th of each month is a special day to pray for sacramentine vocations, which are sorely needed to continue the mission, so that through all of us, Christ continues to give Himself and to serve.

On September 18th, 1694: Peter Vigne was ordained a priest in Bourg Saint-Andéol. He is therefore a priest and a missionary, and this will often be his signature, seen on the front page. Through this grace received, he describes himself as: "father... prudent guide on the path of faith... friend to help us advance on the road to salvation..."

>>>It's a wonderful anniversary to ask for his intercession for priestly vocations "according to the Heart of God"!

<u>OCTOBER</u> The month of the ROSARY. Praying the Rosary allows us to accompany Mary in the joyful, sorrowful, glorious, and luminous hours she experienced with Jesus and the Apostles, and with the Church in its infancy.

Incomparable Virgin Mary, into your hands, we confidently place our joyful and sorrowful moments, and those of the whole world.

"Source of Hope" You are always there, for us..
You, the first on our pilgrimage journey, accompany us.

>>>We can also invoke her with the oldest known prayer, dated from the 3rd or 4th century, therefore before the Council of Ephesus in 431, which declared Mary the Mother of God.



"PREPARE THE PASSOVER" PETER VIGNE

As Pope Leo XIV says, to celebrate the Eucharist, one must "prepare" for it. And Jesus himself asks his apostles to go and prepare the room to celebrate the Last Supper on Holy Thursday. It won't be just anywhere or anyhow! Wherever Peter Vigne was invited to preach a mission he was always mindful of how the village churches or chapels were cared for. When necessary, he didn't hesitate to pick up the broom himself or ask for help! "He applied himself with all his might to beautifying the house of God, making it a more worthy dwelling place for the King of Kings," notes Perrossier.



The church of Boucieu was highly praised in the written report that followed a canonical visit, around 1729. "The high altar and the surrounding altars are perfectly adorned, but all the ornaments belong to Monsieur Vigne who made sure the church was well restored and he himself was the main contributor." However, much remained to be done, according to what the report later says concerning items that belonged to the parishioners: "some old altar cloths....an old alb, an old missal...old communion cloths...an old confessional."

Father Vigne would certainly remedy this, and the Sisters

would help him. In April 1725, he notes in his Journal: "30 sols (an old French coin) must be sent to Monteils. It is for some small ornaments needed for this church. The Sisters will use them." Peter Vigne's profoundly Eucharistic vocation led him to live consistently both the celebration of the Eucharist itself and the "selfless act" of service to those he met in Boucieu and on his missions. His notes show that he felt the pain of those who lived in solitude, poverty, and destitution and offered to help them. "I left 6 livres (old French currency) to Peter Lardy in Rebeugne to care for his dying wife; plus 3 livres and 6 sols to Francis Lespeilac for his children, now living in poverty due to his own foolishness..."; "I gave Marie, who lived in Cros, 12 livres to buy whatever clothes she needed for herself..." As Perrossier concluded, Father Vigne acted "always with moderation, gentleness, and patience, never rushing anything, and using the most perfect charity in his dealings with his neighbour."

This is yet another thank you that must be added to the praises he left us (on the first page). He shares with us all how to live a challenging and beautiful Eucharistic way of life. B.R.
